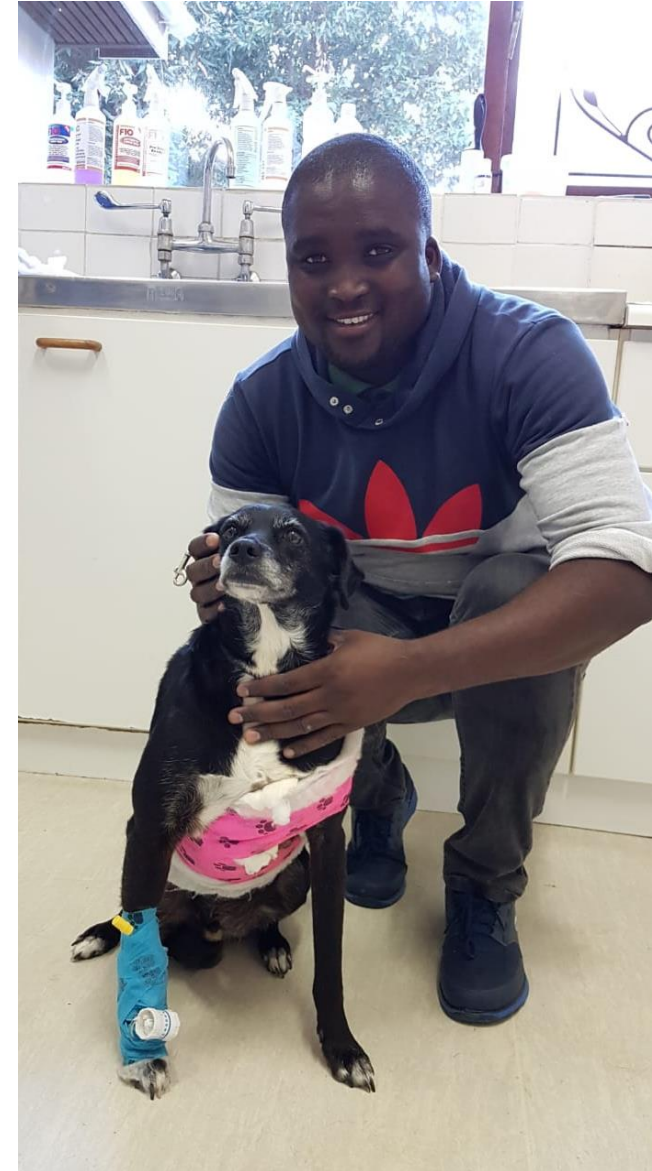

Diesel was protecting his home with his friend, Todd, a Yorkie, when two cowardly males attempted to break-in to their home on the 2 May 2019 while his owners were away . After gaining access to the property, these intruders viciously attacked Diesel by stabbing him with a sharp object several times in the chest.

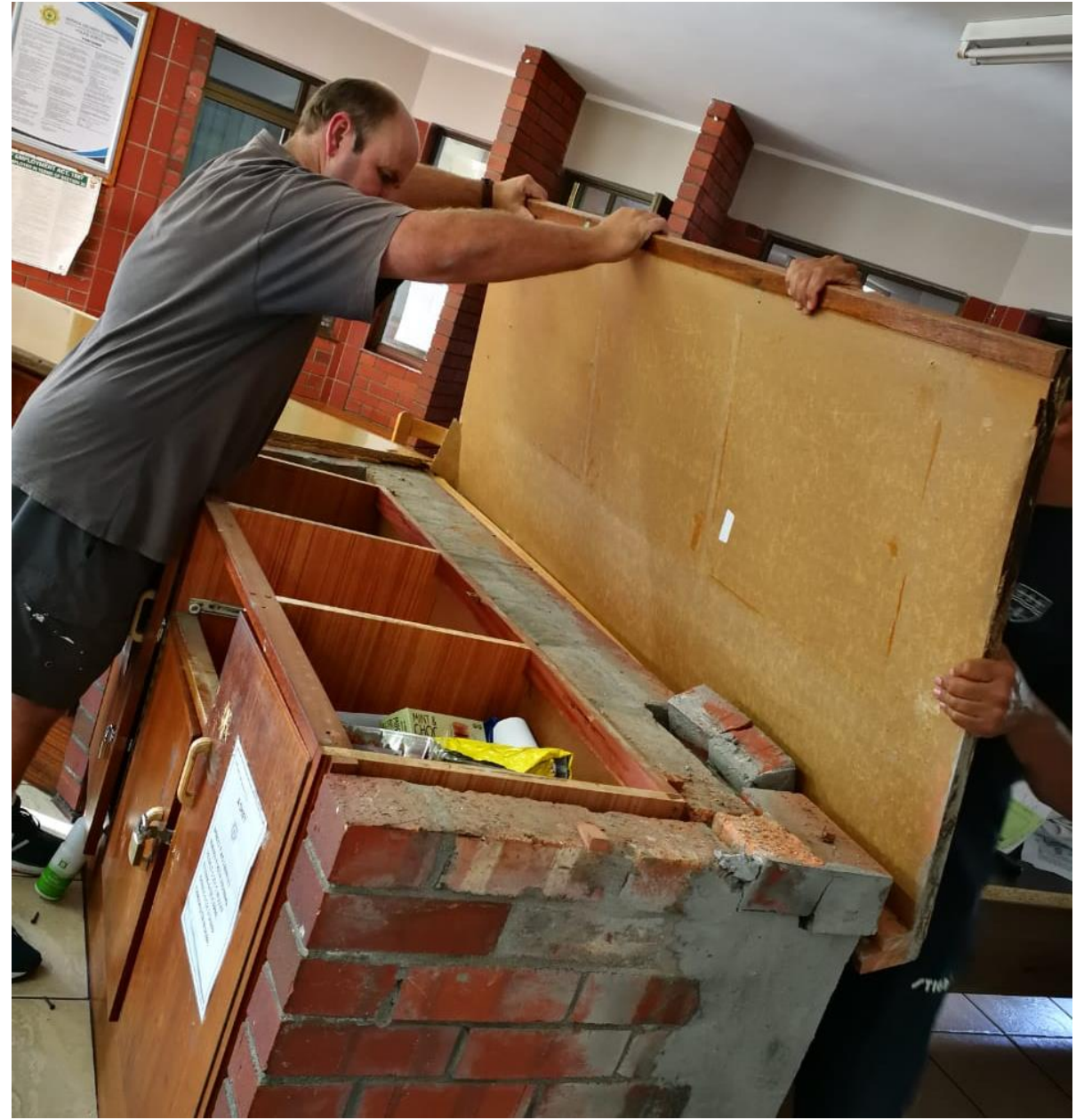
Thanks to vigilant neighbours, who heard a commotion, they were able to alert the Henderson's, who rushed home to find Diesel lying in his yard, bleeding from his wounds.

Diesel was rushed to Fish Hoek Veterinary Clinic where Veterinary Doctors Patti Foster and Jean Russell performed an emergency operation to save Diesel's life. From the nature of Diesel's wounds, it is believed that he physically took on the intruders.

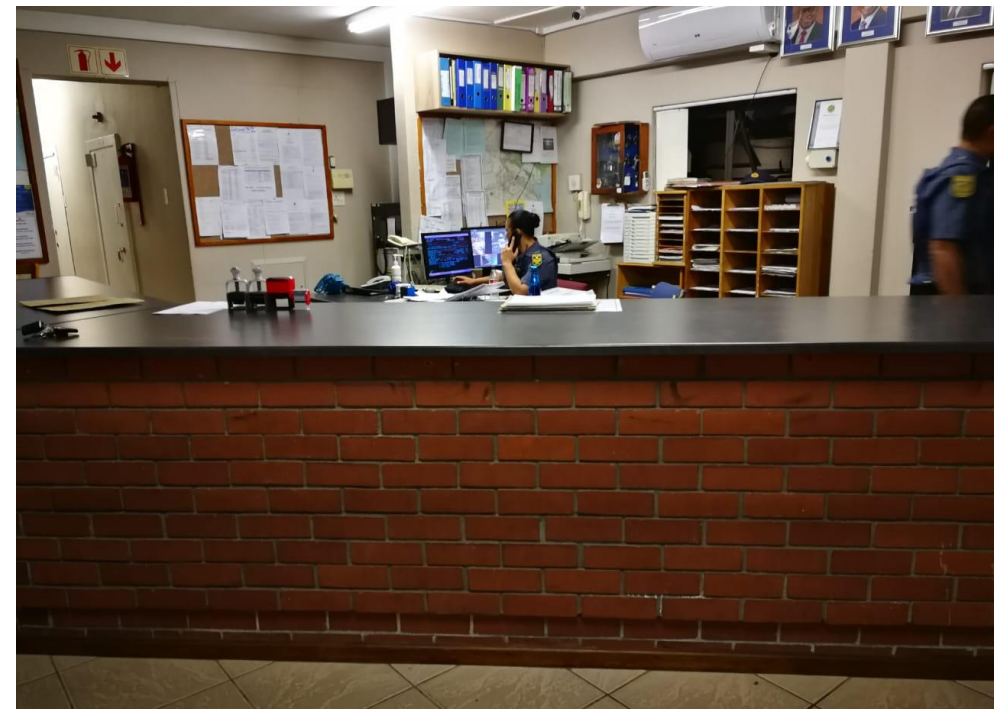
Diesel made a full recovery and is enjoying a happy loving family life with his owners.
